

Christ the King School Announces the Establishment of the Sister Mary Clement Legacy Society for Planned Giving

Sister Mary Clement Groat of the Grey Nuns of the Sacred Heart, served as the first principal of Christ the King School. She came to Atlanta in 1937 to start Christ the King elementary and high school, where she taught grade and served as principal until 1943.

Because of her life-long dedication to Catholic education, and to Christ the School in particular, using Sister Mary Clement's name as the moniker for the Society Planned Giving was a natural decision.
