

Christ the King School Receives Grants for External Improvements

Christ the King School received two \$10,000.00 grants for its Façade Restoration Project from the Harriet McDaniel Marshall Trust and the Walter H. and Marjory M. Rich Memorial Fund respectively, on June 5, 2007.

These funds will be allocated toward re-pointing the classic, French Gothic, limestone façade and replacing the original windows, thereby stabilizing and maintaining the building's external integrity as well as improving energy efficiency and comfort in the classrooms. Considered an architectural landmark, the School sits adjacent to the Cathedral of Christ the King, which was rated by the Atlanta Journal and Constitution as one of Atlanta's top ten significant architectural structures for religious institutions.

Peggy Warner, Principal of Christ the King School says, "We are most grateful to be recipients of these grants. The funds will enable the school to properly restore and maintain the lovely buildings that are a precious inheritance from the founding generations. "

Managed and decided upon by Sun Trust Bank, Atlanta, funding was considered by the Distribution Committee of the Sun Trust Bank, Greene-Sawtell, and Elkin Foundations, the English, Marshall, and Rich Memorial Funds and the Woolford Charitable Trust Fund.

Founded in 1937, Christ the King School celebrates its 70th anniversary as the oldest operating Catholic school in Atlanta. Currently, 551 students continue the School's Catholic tradition of academic excellence in a Christ-centered environment.
