(For Students Entering 6th Grade)

Students entering sixth grade are required to read three (3) books, **and** also complete the Summer Math Skills Sharpener workbook.

- A parent signature is required on the log form certifying that the student did read the three books and did complete the math workbook. The log form is available on the school website.
- Students will have quizzes on the two required teacher selections listed below. **These quizzes will be given the first week of school and these scores will be averaged as part of the student's first quarter grade.** The student chosen selection for Language Arts will be assessed through a project, poster, PowerPoint presentation, etc., which will also be averaged as part of the first quarter grade.
- The math workbook must be turned in to the math teacher and a quiz will be given over a sampling of the problems in this book.

Required books are:

1. Language Arts teacher selection- *Eleven* by Patricia Reilly Giff
2. Language Arts student selection-Choose *one title* from the chart below
3. Social Studies teacher selection- *Blue Jasmine* by Kashmira Sheth
4. Math workbook

For # 2 above, the Language Arts student selection, students may choose one of the titles below OR a biography of their choice OR an age appropriate book from the Georgia Book Award Nominees OR a title from the Newbery Award Winners list.
